Dropping a Course

Students must submit a written request signed by a parent/guardian and obtain administrator approval to drop a course. In making the decision the administrator shall at minimum consider the following factors:

1. Appropriate placement with regards to academic abilities and designated course selection option;
2. Class availability of desired replacement course (full sections/schedule conflicts): and
3. The degree to which the request is arbitrary and capricious.

Students who drop a course after the first 10 school days of a semester will receive an "F" grade, which will appear on their transcript and be figured in their grade point average. However, changes to a course of a lower or higher difficulty in the same subject area may occur with approval of the administrator and the teacher after the first 10 days without receiving an "F" grade.

Classification of High School Students

High school students will be classified by the total number of credits. Students must earn the following number of credits to be classified as a 10th, 11th, or 12th grader:

10 th Grade	6.0 credits
11 th Grade	11.0 credits
12 th Grade	17.0 credits
